Appointment of Staff

To strengthen the regional structure of the network with necessary human resources, Social Development office was strengthened with qualified Staff. Mr. Sagayam was appointed program co-ordinator for ARUWYE in the month of February. He is responsible for coordination, monitoring and evaluation of the activities carried out in the Chennai zone. He is also assigned to write project proposals and annual reports. He would also assist the other zonal coordinators, Sr. Caroline for South Zone and Sr. Lourdu Sagayam for Vellore Zone in the activities of social development in those areas. Ms. Maria Agnes Mary who had been working as Office-assistant in ARUWYE was assigned with an additional responsibility as Accountant. Sr. Elizabeth was appointed placement co-ordinator (part time) in the month of January and Ms. Saranya was appointed placement co-ordinator (part time) in the month of August. The Social Development Team Consisting of Sr. Azarias Arokia Mary Selvi, the Social Development Coordinator; Mr. Sagayam, Programme Coordinator, Miss Saranya, Placement Coordinator and Miss Maria Agnes Mary, Office Staff has made enormous **strides** toward the achievement the set goals of ARUWYE. We bless our Lord and Thank Him for His marvelous accompaniment.

Neighbourhood Children Parliament (NCP) Training

With the motive of offering children an opportunity to practice leadership qualities and to take part in social work activities through various departments of children parliament, six “Two-days' training programme on Neighborhood Children Parliament” was organized by



'ARUWYE' for the Evening Tuition Center students of all three zones of Chennai province covering 34 panchayats in Tamil Nadu. The NCP training was also organized for the selected school students in Chennai province and boarding children in Vellore zone.

The resource-persons for the NCP training were Rev. Dr. Isaac, TN Children Parliament State Convenor and Mr. Paul Thomas, Prime Minister, Tamil Nadu and Pondichery State Youth Parliament.

Altogether 257 children and 31 staff participated in the NCP training programme conducted in 6 places in Tamil Nadu. About 203 children and 20 staff participated from 34 panchayats and 34 children parliaments have been formed and the members of children parliaments are actively participating in parliament meetings.

Through NCP trainings the children got an orientation on the purpose and importance of the formation of NCP trainings in their own panchyats. The children learnt what a parliament is, duties of NCP ministers, how the NCP meetings are to be proceeded and what social work activities they can commit through various departments of NCPs. The short films on child labour and violation of child rights to education and participation enlightened their minds and gave them new ideas to overcome child right violations. The children learnt Social awareness songs which they sang in between sessions and they will be singing them in the beginning of every NCP meeting.

'Model Elections' organized at the end of trainings gave them an idea of how the NCP elections are to be conducted and what are the rules they should abide by while conducting elections. The 'Mock NCP meetings' organized after Model elections taught them the procedure for NCP meetings. The NCP animators were given instruction on how they should form an NCP at Panchayat level.

Success stories from NCPs

Petition given to Panchayat President to take initiative for building a bridge across river

The Agaram panchyat children parliament members discussed in their meeting regarding building a bridge for crossing the river. The issue was brought forth for discussion by the transport minister, Ms. Kalai selvi. She spoke in the parliament meeting and said "The people from kiriyampatti are finding it difficult to cross the river and reach the main road especially during rainy season. Otherwise they have to travel for 3 kilometers for reaching the town. So building a bridge across the river would help the people to cross the river safely." They discussed this issue in the parliament and then decided to write a petition to the panchayat president regarding this. The secretary wrote the petition with help of transport minister and other members and then the president read aloud the petition and passed a resolution on the matter. The president and the transport minister along with three other MPs handed over the petition to the panchayat president of Agaram on 29th October 2011.



Saplings planted on roadsides

The Aathuppatti Panchayat children parliament members planned in their children parliament meetings to buy saplings and to plant them on Ingnachipuram – Athuppatti roadsides. The suggestion came from the environment minister, Ms. Anandhi who proposed that as the 'World Environment Day' was approaching to be celebrated on 5th June and as to give awareness to village people on global warming and its negative consequences on the earth and to show their responsibility to protect the nature from destruction they need to plan for celebrating world environment day. And then constructive suggestion came from other NCP members that they should plan for planting saplings on that day. A resolution was passed on the proposal and the finance minister, Mohan Manoj allocated fund for buying the saplings after discussing with the parliament members. The environment minister took in-charge for buying saplings. On 5th of June 2011, Sunday the parliament members along with other village people gathered in the Parish premises. The parish priest was invited to give an awareness message on protection of environment and bless the saplings before plantation. Thus the children set an example to everyone to take initiative and to care for the nature and keep the environment free from pollution.

Two Ministers elected for Dindigul District Children Parliament

District level children parliament election was organized on 18th Sept 2011 by Anugraha Trust at Nochiyodaipatti in Dindigul District.



Ten children participated from Ulagampatti for the election. Two children namely, Kausalya and Karthik were elected ministers for Dindigul District level children parliament. Kausalya was elected minister for department of education and Karthik for department of art and culture.

Health care

Training on Telemedicine for the Nurses of Salesian Sisters INM



Telemedicine is a wonderful new tool that is proving to be a resource. It has the potential to help millions of people all over the world regardless what their

medical conditions are. It reaches out the people of remote villages with the help of advancement of the telecommunications.

Two days training-programme on Telemedicine was organized by Auxilium Center for Rural Underprivileged women Youth Empowerment (ARUWYE) for the Nurses of Salesian Sisters in collaboration with the Meenakshi Mission Hospital and Research Center (MMHRC), Madurai on 18th and 19th of February, 2011. Eight of Salesian Sisters who are nurses by profession from various communities from all over Tamil Nadu attended the two days training programme. They had their exposure programme in a remote village called 'Thonnukal', Virudhunagar District.

The practice of Telemedicine can be described as a method by which doctors are made available to the Patients, by utilizing the facilities available in Telecommunication, to meet and consult on their illness with the help of a Nurse and through her they prescribe medicines for them.

The practice of Telemedicine is a revolution in Health-care Industry. It builds a bridge between clinicians and patients. It results in developing virtual communities that interacts and shares knowledge for the benefit of communities that live in remote areas.

The participants said that the training was quite informative and new for them and by utilizing the telemedicine facility they can help the villagers with medical treatment for their illness.

Installation of Telemedicine in Thereseapuram, Tuticorin

On 12th December 2011 Telemedicine – Remedy kit was installed in Malar Dispensary, Thereseapuram, Tuticorin. Madurai Meenakshi Mission Hospital true to their motto of offering quality treatment at an affordable cost, came forward to extend their service to the sick people of this area with their multi-specialty treatment through Telemedicine.

The need for specialized treatment for the fisher folk of the area was expressed by Sr.



Soosaimanickam Josephine the ardent nurse who is incharge of the dispensary. She along with Dr. Jenipher reach out to the

medical needs of the sick. Dr. Jenipher renders her service in the evening for a few hours which is not sufficient to meet the requirements of the people. Sr. Josephine who renders 18 hours service per day felt the need for speciality consultation for the people as they suffered from heart disease and respiratory problems which needed treatment in big hospitals which took away the time and money from these poor people and made such treatment unthinkable at times.

The Telemedicine team consisting of Dr. Umashankar, Mrs. Rosemary, the Staff Nurse along with Mr. Mani the Technician arrived on 12th morning and participated in the inaugural function organized by the Management of Malar Dispensary along with Sr. Azarias Arokia Mary Selvi, the Social Development Coordinator, Leaders of the village and Sr. Medaballimi Josephine the Animator of the house. The Telemedicine Center was blessed and inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Thomairajan the Parish Priest of Thereseapuram.

The Dispensary is a boom with specialty treatment available to the sick of this coastal area. May Our Blessed Mother heal the sick and bless our efforts to reach out to the poor and needy.

Distribution of Vitamin Tablets for mothers and children

To ensure and improve basic health and to strengthen preventive and curative health care among underprivileged women and children, ARUWYE organized awareness programme on

“Importance of Vitamins” and provided them Vitamin Tablets freely. The event took place on 20th of March, 2011 in one of the houses of beneficiaries at Kamarajar Colony, Chennai.



Sr. Arokia Mary Selvi, the SDC and Sr. Saluja, a nurse by profession gave them awareness and distributed the Vitamin capsules for the women and the children completed four years of age. This created among them awareness on importance of Vitamins for a healthy living and an opportunity to do away with Malnutrition.

Vocational Trainings

Hand Embroidery on Saris for women

To empower the underprivileged women with an opportunity for Skill Development and



Self-employment in urban areas, three days training programme on “Hand Embroidery work on Saris” was organized for

women at MPT Quarters from 15th to 17th March 2011 by ARUWYE. The trainer was Mr. Daniel from Kanchipuram who is experienced in the field for about 12 years. There participated 15 women in the training and learnt the Hand Embroidery work which would enable them to take up jobs on their own and earn money to improve their socio-economic status.

Nirmala Vocational Training Center, Kodambakkam

Tailoring center

Mrs. M.A.Regina was appointed tailoring teacher since the month of July. She is a professional tailoring teacher and is well experienced in the tailoring field. She teaches tailoring in three shifts from Monday to Friday. There are 4 other trained candidates who are working in Embroidery section. Tailoring classes



resumed from the month of July in the vocational training center at Kodambakkam. About 26 women have successfully completed their tailoring course.

At present about 30 women are attending tailoring classes in three shifts.

Computer courses

A new wing of Computer section with 6 computers started in the month of September. Ms.

Saranya was appointed instructor for the computer center. One batch of 6 members successfully completed the



basic computer course and got job placement in BPOs. Now another batch of 6 members is getting trained in basic computer applications.

Job Placement arranged

A partnership was made with IL & FS Cluster Development Initiative Limited, Vishaka Consultancy and E-Publishers to give job placement for the trained candidates. The candidates who complete the DTP courses in computers are offered Data Entry or Voice process Jobs in BPOs and Publishers.

Auxilium Vocational Training Center, Ulagampatti

With the vision, “to provide possibilities of growth and meaningful life for every girl and woman” Sisters in Ulagampatti plunged into setting up a vocational training center for young girls and women. The vocational Training center began its mission in a rented house at Vadakkur, a village near Ulagampatti. Along with the vocational training programme, awareness about human rights, general health, and education to love are also offered to enable the recipients to gain integral formation to live their citizenship.



To build self-esteem and enhance income earning opportunities for young women of all income groups in the community, the Tailoring center is set up. Its recipients are uneducated and school drop outs. The computer center helps the educated school leavers.

On 24th September 2011, Fr. Amaladoss, the parish priest of Ulagampatti blessed the centers and Sr.Ignaci Kulandai Theresa, the Superior of Auxilium, Ulagampatti opened the centers. The training teacher Ms. Saleth Mary of Vellode and the neighbors were presented for the event. At present 20 women and young girls are learning skills in the tailoring center and 10 school children and 8 young girls learning computer education. The sister in charge and the Superior visit the center regularly and give inputs on the various themes to actualize our vision and plans. The center stands as a threshold for the advancement of as entrepreneurs in the future.

PCM cum LFA Training Programme

Two days' Training on Project Cycle Management (PCM) cum Logical Framework Approach (LFA) was organized at the SEARCH Ashram, Mannivakkam, Chennai on 30th and 31st of March, 2011. Rev. Fr. Joseph Xavier S J, the Consultant for FMA National Development Forum was the resource person for the training programme. There participated 9 sisters and one lay staff in the training programme.

The training started with an inaugural session which was followed by prayer song, welcome address, honouring the resource person and felicitation. Mr. Sagayam, the Program co-ordinator of ARUWYE, welcomed Fr. Joseph Xavier S.J, the resource person, Sr. Mary, the Superior of the house, Sr. Josephine, the former Provincial, Sr. Azarias Arokia Mary Selvi, the SDC and the sisters from various communities of Chennai province. The resource person was honored with a shawl garmented by Sr. Jeyamani. Sr. Pitchai Mary Saroja, the Superior of the house and Sr. Arul Josephine, the former Provincial welcomed all the participants and wished them fruitful training.

Fr. Joseph Xavier S.J, the resource person started the session with a group exercise, that is, he divided the group into two and asked them to write down all the different steps they know to write a project proposal. The two groups

presented their work for evaluation. The resource person observed their answers and commented on them wherever necessary.

The resource person explained how to write a scientific and saleable project and prepare a proposal with a log frame or project design which clearly states the specific objectives, results, activities, verifiable indicators and means of verification based on which budgets may be prepared at the end. He made the groups to work on a particular project proposal applying the principles of LFA that helped the participants to learn it in a practical way. He also explained all other steps to write down a complete project proposal. He insisted to use 'Excel sheet' to put up the budget and explained its usefulness by showing his various works. He said that the donors expect the Budget to be done in an Excel sheet rather than in MS word, because they may find it easier to calculate and verify the budget in an Excel Sheet.

The two day PCM training programme ended with an evaluation session. Every one of the participants said that it was the first time that they had come across such systematic and scientific proposal writing. All the sessions were informative and brainstorming. The group exercises helped them to give vent to all their ideas and to learn from their mistakes. Every one affirmed that they would definitely practice it while they write new project proposals.



Soft Skills Training for FMA Sisters and lay staff

“Soft skills” is one of the most important criteria for employability and competence in today's world of business. One may be gifted with creativity and have an outstanding knowledge and vision but if he or she cannot motivate others to embrace and execute his innovative ideas there is no point of having talents. With an objective of helping the FMA staff to adopt in them the practices of soft skills; ARUWYE organized two days' training programme on “Soft Skills for FMA sisters and Staff”.

The training was organized at “Sangamam” at Keela Eral in Tuticorin Dt on 22nd and 23rd of October 2011. The total number of participants was 38 in which 28 participants were lay staff and 10 participants were FMA sisters. The trainers were Mrs. Karthika Banu who is experienced over 13 years as soft skills Trainer and Mr. Rajan who is a social worker for about 20 years.



Mrs. Banu insisted that each person should have a Unique Selling Point (USP) and they should try to identify and develop that unique selling point in them. She also insisted that those who wanted to be best teachers should know to inspire their students. An individual 'SWOT' analysis helped to know their potentiality and the resources available to them.

The participants realized the importance of having Interpersonal skills, like listening, questioning, language and communication and conflict handling. Through group activities they were able to identify and develop 'creativity' of

individuals, to increase their power of concentration and to come out of stage fear. The participants tried their level best to bring out the best in them and came out with inspiring ideas in group activities. They understood the definition and importance of 'self-esteem' and 'assertiveness'. They realized the need for accepting responsibility or being accountable and managing conflicts. They got to know to do a 'root cause analysis' for their failure and apply a 'Win Win Method' which is possible only through team work for reaching out success. They learnt the value of time and how the time should be planned and prioritized for activities.

Every one of the participants acknowledged that the training gave them a new knowledge of how they can adopt themselves to an organizational atmosphere and how they can use their skill and ability better for achieving the organizational goals and also for their personal growth.

Career Guidance for Students of Non-formal Education

Well planned and well organized career guidance services are increasingly important. The students, trainees and employees require having access to high quality information and advice about education, training and work.

Career guidance refers to services and activities intended to assist individuals, of any age and at any point throughout their lives, to make educational, training and occupational choices



and to manage their careers. Such services may be found in schools, universities and colleges, in training institutions, in

public employment services, in the workplace, in the voluntary or community sector and in the private sector. The activities may take place on an individual or group basis, and may be face-to-face or at a distance (including helplines and

web-based services). They include career information provision (in print, ICT-based and other forms), assessment and self-assessment tools, counseling interviews, career education programmes (to help individuals develop their self awareness, opportunity awareness, and career management skills), taster programmes (to sample options before choosing them), work search programmes, and transition services.

To teach the students of non-formal education life-scoping skills like self confidence, self-esteem, motivation and determination and to take them through various job opportunities and select their career carefully, ARUWYE organized two 'One day career guidance programs'; one for the Mariyalaya community college, Broadway and Nirmala Vocational Training Institute, Kodambakkam together on 31st Oct and another for the Thiruppur Mariyalaya community college on 22nd November. Altogether about 95 students benefitted from the programmes. The resource persons were Fr. Anbu and Fr. Jose from SALT academy and Ms. Sathya Devi from IL & FS Multi Skills School at Palladam and Ms. Kavitha and Mr. Rarish from IL & FS Clusters Development Pvt. Ltd.

Different sessions on Motivation, Self-confidence, perseverance and professionalism and various exercises on personality helped the students to gain confidence on their potentiality and to know their level of self-esteem. They suggested possible ways of developing their personality and growing into greater personality. The students learnt to plan to achieve their goal and to be focused in their career. They learnt to apply 'SMART' principle when they plan their goal. They understood the definition of a career and how important it is to carefully choose a career and why they should choose a career. They learnt to manage their time in an efficient manner. Group activities in-between sessions kept them alert and improved their ability to concentrate.

The students were encouraged to become entrepreneurs of their own by starting up their own business utilizing their creativity, potential and other resources. The students affirmed that the career guidance helped them start thinking about their career in advance and plan systematically to achieve their goals.

Study on Market Feasibility

Any business or organization facing a significant investment or risk in developing a new product or service should consider conducting market feasibility, needs assessment and/or competitive intelligence marketing research. Conducting market feasibility and competitive intelligence marketing research early in the development cycle can provide a "reality check" on your idea as well as help define product development to ensure its appeal for your customers.

Market Feasibility training program was organized by ARUWYE for the sisters and lay staff working in social development sectors on 23rd November 2011 at Mariyalaya Tiruppur. A team of trainers came from IL & FS Pvt., Ltd to give inputs on various trades and their market feasibility. Ms. Kavitha, Mr. Raja Ganesh and Mr. Rarish from IL & FS Clusters Development initiative Pvt., Ltd, Chennai and Ms. Sathya Devi and Mr. Vijayan from IL & FS Skills Schools at Palladam formed the resource team. Fourteen sisters and six lay staff from various social development centers of Chennai province attended the training program.

The participants came to know the various activities of IL&FS Clusters Development initiative Pvt., Ltd. They learnt that there are 346 skill training centers and four multi skills schools across India through which they have trained over 7 lakh in skill Enhancement. They learnt the various industrial programs namely apparel manufacturing, leather fabrication, service sector and engineering and job market available for those trades. An elaborate session was conducted



on service-sectors such as retail, catering, driving and security. They said about 28% of annual growth rate during last five years was due to service sectors. They got to know the market feasibility in IT sector where jobs are available in BPO, Software Developer and Hardware maintenance & Networking. They said that multimedia and animation gives a number of job openings and good earnings.

The job market available in construction sector like masonry, carpentry and barbendry and in health sector as hospital assistants, nursing, optometry, ICU technician and lab technician was well explained and it was very useful to the participants. They said that engineering is not only for boys, but also for girls. They affirmed that they taught welding to a group of 10 girls who are now experts in the field and they earn a good package of salary.

The participants also got an input on agriculture and allied sectors on which a research is being done by IL&FS to include agriculture and allied sectors as one of their projects. They got an idea about various agro-based programmes like animal husbandry, plantation, irrigation methods, green house technology, nutrient and pest management, organic farming, sericulture, apiculture, farm forestry and food processing industry which they may initiate in their project areas.

On the whole, the market feasibility training helped every participant to gain new knowledge on job markets currently available in various sectors. This will help them to choose the right trade for initiating IGP's and also to guide others to choose their career.

Magic Show for fund-raising

ARUWYE in order to strengthen its Network and to have partnership with other organizations takes initiative to organize programs in collaboration with other local NGOs.

A Magic Show was organized by ARUWYE on 26th February, 2011, in collaboration with Jeevanadi, a local organization working for women empowerment and rural development. It was a fund raising

programme organized in motive of supporting financially the upcoming programmes, namely institution of spoken English Labs and Telemedicine centers.



Tickets had been made ready for the show and they were being sold. ARUWYE approached the nearby Schools and the parishes to ask them for donations by giving Magic show tickets to them.

A huge fund was expected through magic show, but the expected result was not attained, because 'magic show' was not everyone's preference of entertainment, so failed to attract a large number of audience.

Future plans

NCP Children's Mela
