Empowering Tomorrow's Leaders: The Neighbourhood Children's Parliament

ARUWYE believes strong communities start young. Through Neighbourhood Children's Parliaments (NCPs), We foster leadership in students. NCPs tackle real-world issues like poverty and social justice, educating children on their rights and encouraging civic engagement. By participating in simulated parliaments, children learn collaboration, problem-solving, and the power of their voices. These early experiences nurture responsible citizens prepared to advocate for a brighter future. 300 students from supplementary evening study Centres are trained on Children parliament and conducts Meetings in their localities to discuss about their issues and solutions.

By participating in NCPs, children are better prepared to navigate societal complexities, uphold democratic values, and contribute meaningfully to creating a brighter and more equitable future.

ECOLOGICAL CONSCIOUSNESS AND CARE FOR COMMON HOME

Children need to live in a world fit for them. Over the years the earth and its resources are exploited and healthy planet now became a concern. So, through creating ecological awareness we create ecological consciousness among children and adults.

To ensure these following activities are carried out,

Empowering Children for a Sustainable Future:

Conducted awareness program and encouraged children to make small changes in their daily routines, like reducing the plastic waste, using reusable bags, kitchen gardening and conserving water. Mrs. Loga Mary, Environmentalist explained the children how they can grow their own food in their home. She also distributed Seeds to children as a part of the programme.







BEAUTICIAN COURSE

Aruwye is committed to expanding opportunities for women by offering a Beautician Course. This program aims to equip women with the skills and knowledge to enter the beauty industry.

- ➤ Basic Beautician Course: This foundational course likely provides essential skills in areas like skincare, makeup application, and basic hair styling.
- Advanced Beautician Course: This advanced program likely builds upon the skills learned in the basic course, offering more in-depth training in specialized techniques.



Five women successfully enrolled in and completed the beautician course. These women have taken the initiative to launch their own home-based beauty services, demonstrating the program's effectiveness in empowering them towards financial independence.



BASIC IT FOR WOMEN

Aruwye recognizes the importance of digital literacy in today's world. This year, we made significant strides in bridging the digital divide for women by training a remarkable 682 women in basic IT skills. This program equips women with fundamental computer skills, potentially including Basic computer operations, MS-Office, Internet access and browsing skills. By gaining these skills, women are empowered to increase their employability in a job market that increasingly demands digital literacy.



LIVELIHOOD - INCOME GENERATING ACTIVITIES

Our dedicated skilled staffs oversee the production of a diverse range of handcrafted products like Jute Bags, Orlii liquid laundry wash, candles, garlands, embroidered kerchiefs, Art Works and Stitching and Altering Clothes.

We actively market these products by setting up stalls in Churches, schools, colleges and Companies.







YESUMATHI'S JOURNEY

Being the first graduate in my family, I felt immense pride. Growing up in a fisherman's community, our lives were always modest. But after graduation, a fear crept in. The job market demanded more than just my degree. While I could read and write English, speaking it fluently terrified me. This fear held me back from reaching my full potential.

A turning point came when trainers from the Aruwye visited our college. They briefed me about Career Connect program that perfectly matched my needs - building communication and computer skills. Joining the program was the best decision I ever made. The trainers created a supportive environment that helped me overcome my fear of English. In just three months, I wasn't just confident speaking English, I had also gained basic IT proficiency and improved my typing speed.

AWARENESS ON ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING

In the past year, our organization has made significant strides in raising awareness about antihuman trafficking among vulnerable communities. Through a series of impactful initiatives, we have reached a wide audience, including government school children, College students, communities, and hostels.

IMPACT AND REACH:

- **Government School Children:** Nearly 500-1000 government school children were educated on human trafficking through engaging street plays. These plays effectively portrayed the tactics used by traffickers and educated children on how to seek assistance if they find themselves in vulnerable situations.
- **Communities:** Awareness sessions were conducted in nearly 5 communities, reaching out to residents and empowering them with knowledge about human trafficking. Vigilance committees were formed in these communities to enhance awareness and provide a support system against trafficking.
- **Hostels:** Awareness programs were conducted in nearly 5 hostels, targeting both residents and staff. These programs aimed to educate and empower individuals to recognize and prevent human trafficking.
- **Migrants:** Approximately 200 migrants were also included in our awareness programs. These programs were designed to inform migrants about the risks of human trafficking and to provide them with resources and support to stay safe and vigilant.

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY EDUCATION
